Achievement and attainment for end of Summer term 2015

General trend

By the end of Year 6, Pupil Premium Funded children perform equally as well as other children in their class. They make better progress than other pupils in their class and pupils nationally.

EYFS

No children were eligible for Pupil Premium in this year group

KS1

Three children were eligible for PPG in Year 1. All children are at age expectations for Reading. Two children are at age expectations for Writing and Maths. One child is, and will continue to receive extra support to make accelerated progress in order to reach age expectations. All three children have made good progress this year.

Five children were eligible for PPG in Year2. Good progress was made by all children from their starting points. All children, except one attained NC Level 2B and above in Reading and Maths. Three children attained NC Level 2B and above in writing.

KS2

New assessments are being used by the school from January 2015 onwards to assess the new National Curriculum. The school is now using STAT Sheffield materials. The new curriculum is much harder than the previous one. Staff are beginning to use new assessments in Years 3, 4 and 5 and continue to receive training and support to reach judgements and moderate those judgements, in school and, with colleagues outside school. Therefore some judgements may not be as accurate during this interim process.

Eleven children were eligible for PPG in Year 3. Four children attained age related expectations in Reading and Writing and two in Maths (Secure Year 3). Nine children are working within the Year 3 curriculum for reading and have made good progress. Seven children are now working in the Year 3 curriculum for writing, five children making good or better progress. Six children are

working in the Year3 curriculum in Maths, three children making good or better progress. Attainment step achieved is similar to rest of the class in all subjects except for Maths, which is lower. All children are making similar progress to other pupils in the class and better progress in Spelling Punctuation and Grammar (SP&G).

Five children were eligible for PPG in Year 4. Two children are working in Year 4 curriculum in reading, one working at age related expectations and one making excellent progress. Two children are working in the Year 4 curriculum for writing and two children have made good progress. Two children are working in the Year 4 curriculum for Maths and one made good progress. Attainment step achieved is similar to that of other children in the class in all subjects.

Six children were eligible for PPG in Year 5. All children except one are working in the year 5 curriculum, one at expected for the Year group at S5. Four children are working within the Year 5 curriculum for writing, three children making good or better progress. Five children are working within the Year 5 curriculum for Maths, one at the expected for the end of the year (S5). Attainment step achieved is similar to the rest of the class and slightly better in Maths.

Six children were eligible for PPG in Year6. All children achieved NC Level 4 and above in all subjects except for one child who attained L5 in Reading, L4 in Writing and L3 in Maths. Average point score achieved was similar to rest of the class for reading, slightly below in writing and maths. From KS1 to KS2: In reading, four children made 2 levels progress and 2 children made 3 levels. In writing, four children made 2 levels progress and two children made 3 levels. In maths, 3 children made 2 levels progress and 3 children made 3 levels. Good and better progress made by these children in KS2 in line and slightly better than other children in their class.
