Ways to help at home...

Spend time with your child in the nursery environment to ensure they are settled and happy. Don't sneak off, tell your child you are leaving and will be back at the end of the session. Share any problems or concerns you have with the nursery staff, we are always hear to listen and help.

Take your children to the park and soft play areas and allow them to manage their own risks. To develop their fine motor skills (writing skills) give them time to play with playdough, paint, tread beads, and make marks.

Encourage them to become more independent with their self care, by allowing them to put on their own coats and shoes, wash their hands.

Give your children lots of time to talk and share their experiences with you. When you're out and about play listening games to help your child 'tune in' to environmental sounds; "Can you hear the car, bird, plane, voices etc.
